OUR INDIAN TRIBE

As I stepped off the plane in Delhi and collected my bags, I found myself immediately in the embrace of a jolly, charismatic, caring, kind, loving, and lovable Indian man: our tour guide for the next two weeks. After hugging everyone in our group, he introduced himself as Ralphy Jhirad and then introduced his equally amazing son, Nathaniel Jhirad.

Ralphy and his wife, Yael (whom we met later on in the trip along with their other son, Avniel), and their two sons are Bnei Israel, a "tribe" of Jews who now dominate Mumbai Jewry. The story goes that the Bnei Israel are the descendants of seven Jewish families who fled Israel in the time of the destruction of the second Temple and were shipwrecked off the coast of Alibag, which is just south of Mumbai. They kept various Jewish traditions and migrated up towards Mumbai. Today, following a big controversy, the Bnei Israel are recognized as full-fledged halachic Jews, and have risen to prominent positions both in India and in Israel.

As the days went by, I began forming a personal connection with Ralphy, and, when she arrived, his wife Yael. Yael is the founder and president of WIZO in India, and we hit it off im-

mediately after I told her I had been volunteering at WIZO's clothing collection/donation center in Jerusalem all year. She told me about the troubles she's been having finding people to volunteer for WIZO in India, and finding the money to sponsor activities, events, etc. We were having dinner together discussing the future of India's newly founded chapter of WIZO, and Ralphy came over and sat down with us. He began asking about my Jewish community at home, and I told him about BEKI, my synagogue, and the warm, nurturing nature of our community. He seemed impressed, but didn't bring it up again until our last day in India, at a small restaurant in Mumbai.

I was having lunch with a friend, and Ralphy came over and asked to speak with me for a minute. I obliged, and followed him back to a table where he and his family were having lunch. Ralphy procured a large, red velvet box from Yael's purse, and handed it to me, saying "This is a gift, from the Jewish community of Mumbai to the Jewish community of New Haven, to your amazing synagogue." I opened the box and found a large, golden Mezuzah, which Ralphy explained was hand-

made by a member of his synagogue in Mumbai. I was in shock and awe at this man's compassion and love for Jews of all kinds, and thanked him for the extraordinary gift.

A couple of weeks after my return to America, I was greeted with an email from Ralph saying he hoped we had all made it home okay and that I had gotten enough sleep after our sleepless couple of weeks in India and the 60 hours of travel back to New Haven. I replied thanking him for his consideration and telling him how much the Synagogue loved the Mezuzza he sent with me and the gratitude

everyone felt towards him and his amazing family.

A few days after that, I saw Nathaniel in New Jersey and gave him a BEKI cookbook and a book on the history of Jews in New Haven to bring home for his parents as a small gesture of gratitude from our community. About a month later, when Nathaniel had returned to his home in India, I received another email from Ralph with exclamations of gratitude and amazement at what a beautiful community BEKI must be to have sent such wonderful gifts to his family. As Ralph said, "Jews are all brothers and sisters, and this connection we've made is truly important, and one to cherish forever. We have so much to learn from each other."

Expertly led by **Steven Fraade**, **Rabbi Alan Lovins**, **Rabbi Murray Levine** and others, the Shabbat Shalom Learners' Minyan is a nurturing exploration of practice and theory presented in a participatory, non-threatening and multi-generational setting. Many members who take advantage of this unique offering feel a deeper sense of awe born of increased understanding and appreciation of the services. Everyone is welcome to participate

regardless of religious status or background.

Mondays

Rashi Study Group

Each Monday morning from 7:45 to 8:30 adults meet in the Library Chapel to read Rashi's commentary on the Torah. It is possible to join the study group for a single meeting or to begin at any time. Knowledge of Hebrew is not necessary. Rashi purported to explain the *peshat* of the text, i.e., the meaning in its historical, literary and linguistic context. Visitors and new participants are welcome. The Rashi Study Group meets immediately following the 7 a.m. *shaharit* service (but begins at 9:45 a.m. on Oct. 11, Columbus Day). With Jon-Jay Tilsen.

Wednesdays

Word for the Day

The Wednesday morning service (shaharit) features a 90-second "Hebrew word for the day" to promote the learning of Hebrew. The Hebrew language is highly structured. Most words are based on three-letter roots, and are made with a limited set of verb or noun forms. By learning a few dozen roots and a small set of word-forms, it is possible to roughly translate Hebrew words isolated from any context, something not normally possible in English. The Word for the Day often relates to the weekly scriptural readings, enhancing personal study and public Torah discussion.

Rabbis' Study Group

Wednesdays with Murray is a weekly study group exclusively for rabbis, facilitated by Rabbi Murray Levine. The Wednesday study group affords local rabbis an opportunity to pursue their own *talmud torah* (Torah study) in a "safe" setting and with opportunities to learn from each other's

experience and insight. The study group meets Wednesday mornings in the Rosenkrantz Family Library. Meetings resume Oct. 6. For more information, call Rabbi Murray Levine at (203) 397-2513.

Thursdays

Mini Morning Learning Service

The Thursday morning services are supplemented with commentary and teaching relating to the history, themes, choreography and language of the daily morning service. Shaharit service is from 8:15 a.m. to 9 a.m. on Thursdays; on other weekdays, the service begins at 7 o'clock.

Sanhedrin Talmud Study Group

The *Sanhedrin Talmud Study Group* meets weekly on Thursdays during the lunch hour (12:30 to 1:30). The Group has met weekly since 1999. For some participants, this is their first direct experience with Talmud text; for others, it is a continuation of a long journey. The Group focuses on the issues raised in the Talmud, with less attention to the technical aspects of the text. Knowledge of Hebrew or Aramaic is helpful but not required.



Building & Improvement

I come from a long line of builders. My grandfather, Ed Tilsen, of blessed memory, started “Twin City Building & Improvement” in the 1930s. Later, my father Bob Tilsen, with his father Ed, and subsequently on his own, and still later with my brother Jim, and now his son Geoff, built thousands of affordable high-quality homes, mostly in Min-

nesota, under the trade names “Tilsen Homes” and “Tilsenbilt Homes.”

But long before that, our ancestors were in the building business: “... And they built garrison cities for Pharaoh, namely Pithom and Ramses” (Exodus 1:11). I suggested to my brother that he change his tagline slogan from “Quality Homes since 1938” to “In business since 1238 BCE”; it is still under consideration.

The name “Building & Improvement” succinctly describes the mission of the Jewish People among the nations. While others were busy destroying our homeland or devastating Europe, building and shooting rockets at Jewish villages in Israel, or refining uranium to wipe us off the map, the main Jewish mission has been to build schools, synagogues, communities, businesses, farms and our homeland. Directing resources to military defense is viewed at best as an unfortunate necessity.

Many of us look with sadness at neighbors who have used their resources, including massive international fund transfers, for no purpose other than to finding ways to destroy us. Had they used those resources to build instead of destroy, they could have accomplished so much.

The essential Jewish response to Nebuchadnezer, Titus, Chmielnicki, Ibrahim Pasha, the Okhrana, Amin al-Huseini, Hitler and Hizb-Allah has been to rebuild our communities and to rebuild our homeland.

Part of our respect for diversity within the Jewish community comes from the accepted system of creating new

institutions. If someone doesn't like a school or synagogue, there is no need to destroy it – rather, one can either try to improve it or build a better replacement.

Whether building anew or improving what others have started, this creative impulse is essential to our Jewish civilization. We can be proud that Jewish individuals have contributed so much to world civilizations and have managed to rebuild our homeland. So often I hear members of our community say in one form or another that their essential aim in life is to somehow make the world a little better. This means building and improving, not destroying.

Our congregation is a community of builders. Beyond building our own families and professional endeavors, the effort to build and maintain a synagogue community – in every aspect from brick and mortar to Torah and hesed – is astounding. It is a true and noble expression of the strivings of our hearts and of an essential impulse of traditional Jewish culture. Happily, there is still seemingly endless opportunity and need for more building and improvement right here, just like in the rest of the world. If we can make our synagogue just a little better, we will have fulfilled part of our mission.
