# Some Security Tips for High Holidays & Year 'Round from Jay Sokolow

Please keep our doors locked. Don't hold the door open for someone you don't know. Allow our greeters to assess and allow entrance.

Know where the exits are.

In case of evacuation, don't go to your car. That will block emergency vehicle access. Walk to the library on Harrison St and await instructions there.

Learn how to use the Nightlock to secure the doors in case we need to lockdown.

Please help us reduce clutter, especially in the coat room. Take your stuff home. Please label anything you leave at the shul with a tag that can be read from the outside.

If you see something or someone suspicious, let a greeter or security person know ASAP.

Don't allow your kids to run in the halls.

Please consider volunteering as a greeter.

Shabbat Schmooze "Recognition and Justice for Victims of Sexual Violence in Conflict" with Professor Ruth Halperin-Haddari

Professor Halperin-Haddari is a family law expert in both the civil legal system and traditional Jewish law and completed three terms as a member of the UN Committee on Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW). She publishes on family law in Israel, legal pluralism, feminism and halacha, and international women's rights. She is a recipient of numerous national and international grants and prizes.
