
We are so grateful for the volunteers, both parents and other community members, who lead this programming and make it so special.





used to fence as a child. I fenced épée, and although I was not tall enough to be very good, I loved it. And so I appreciate the following teaching I once heard, based on this midrash:

Just as in a duel, the two combatants go into a room,

and you know who wins, because they exit with their sword held high, so too does Israel go into a

room with the Yetzer Hara (the evil inclination) in Elul, and we know who wins because Israel comes out holding their lulay high!

I can't remember the source of this midrash. But it's clearly an interpretation of the following midrash about Sukkot (Midrah Tehillim 118):

On Rosh Hashanah, all nations stand in judgment before the Holy Blessed One, and each nation says, "We have triumphed in judgment." But on Yom Kippur, the Holy Blessed One, pardons Israel and forgives their sins, as it says (Leviticus 16:30), "For on this day God will forgive you."

Yet, we still do not know who won the judgment, whether Israel or the nations of the world. When the holiday of Sukkot arrives, all Israel take their lulays and proclaim their faith in the righteous one of the world, as if he has come and conquered, and they know that Israel has won the judgment. Therefore, say to the righteous that it is good.

What does all of this mean? For one thing, it means that, if you see a kid hitting another kid with a lulav, and you say, "a lulav is not a sword," well... it kind of is a sword.

But more than that, it means that Sukkot

is a celebration of all the spiritual work you've done over the holidays. It's a way to say: we really got through this together. It's a time to feel proud and thankful.

I'm writing this in early September, but you should be reading it around Yom Kippur. May you celebrate the growth you have gone through, and if you feel that perhaps you need more growing — more teshuvah — you certainly have time to do it, if you start now. So wave your lulay high.
